

Accessibility for People with Disabilities at Oakmont Carnegie Library

- A member of the OCL board, Paul Pastierik, is the person appointed to oversee all building issues. Although the Borough has an engineer, Paul oversees, bids, repairs and accessibility issues in regard to the library. He can be contacted at 412.828.9532x1
- The majority of programs are held in the *lower level* of the library which has elevator access, two ramps and entrances and wheelchair accessible restrooms
- Each computer in the library is loaded with the following programs: Jaws 14.0 (for vision impairment), MAGIC 12.0 (Screen Magnifier with speech) and FS Reader, a computer screen reader. We also have large print and audio materials and an affiliated relationship with the Library for The Blind and Physically Handicapped. We have audio technologies for our meeting rooms (speakers and microphones) and equipment such as hand fidgets for autistic children attending programming.
